#### From our Archives: the 'Redlands Fair'

The history of our 'Autumn' Spring Fair goes all the way back to 1893 when it was referred to as 'The School Bazaar'. This inaugural event raised funds for the yet to be built North Shore Hospital and 50 pounds was raised, equivalent to \$9000 at the time, when the number of students was no more than 50.

In the early 1900s the re-named 'Garden Fete' raised money for hospitals, including the newly opened Royal North Shore Hospital.

In 1915 it was the 'Australia Day Fete', and in 1919 'The Old Girls' Fete' raised money for the Children's Hospital.

By 1932 the Fete was supporting the Old Girls' Union Bursary Fund, and in 1934 the Old Girls gifted a domestic Science Room in Liggins Building plus another bursary.

We are thrilled to share that Amelia Cormack, a truly 'multigenerational' Redlander, is performing in 'Hadestown' at the Walter Kerr Theatre on Broadway! Hadestown is the Winner of eight 2019 Tony Awards, including Best Musical and the 2020 Grammy Award for Best Musical Theatre Album.

Amelia is a New York based singer, actor, musician, voice over artist and songwriter.

She was an original Diva in Priscilla, Queen of the Desert The Musical, and performed the role in Australia and New Zealand for nearly 2 years, then went on to reprise the role on London's West End.

She has toured the US with Kinky Boots, Les Misérables and Come From Away, and originated the role of Raven Johnson in Douglas Lyons and Ethan Pakchar's, Beau.

But that's not all. Amelia's family leave behind an important legacy at the school. Her mother and aunts are all Redlanders, and her grandfather, Basil Phillips, even attended the school as a young boy and it was his ancestors' family home, built in 1883, that became 'the College' in October 1899. The property had '*extensive grounds and excellent accommodation for boarders*'. The school officially took the name 'College for Girls, Redlands' at this time.
